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LOGLINE

There are 80,000 native Irish speakers in Ireland.

6,000 live in the North of Ireland.

Three of them became a rap group called Kneecap.

This is the real life story of how this anarchic Belfast trio became the unlikely figureheads of a civil rights movement to save their mother tongue.

SYNOPSIS

In post-troubles Belfast, the riotous rap trio KNEECAP emerges, setting the stage for the Irish language's resurgence against the establishment. Self-proclaimed 'low life scum' Liam Óg and Naoise, along with school teacher JJ, become a political symbol and the defiant voice of Ireland's restless youth.

As they struggle to make their mark on the world, and family and relationship pressures threaten to pull the plug on their dreams, the trio weave a narrative that transcends music. A true-life fable about man's intrinsic urge for identity, the allure of drugs and a passion for life, KNEECAP is a thrilling ride pulsating with hip-hop beats.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

This project started back in October 2019, when, on a whim, I went out in Belfast to see an upand-coming hip hop act called *Kneecap*. I understood nothing of the Irish language they were rapping in, but it was clear many in the sold-out crowd knew every word. The raw energy and authenticity this band possessed was undeniable.

After a few months of failing miserably to entice them to have a drink with me, they finally caved. That drink lasted until some ungodly time the following morning. But the gauntlet had been laid down – we would make a film. It was going to be as bold, raw and unrelenting as Kneecap's music. I needed to learn Irish pronto.

It is often said the best films parachute their audience into a time and place uniquely of its own. *Mo Chara*, *Móglaí Bap* and *DJ Provaí* encapsulated a vision of Belfast and modern Ireland arrestingly different to the one we all called home. A country still suffering PTSD after decades of conflict. One without a functioning government over Unionist politician's refusal to grant Ireland's native language equal status to English. From the outset this language and its relationship with identity felt central to the story we wanted to tell. Liam Óg, Naoise and JJ spoke with passion and nuance about the Irish language movement which had been growing alongside their ascent as artists. As a big fan of old-school hip hop, for me the parallels between Kneecap's relationship with language echoed the controversy African American rappers once created in reinventing the English tongue to reflect their own urban, oppressed social reality.

When the script was written and the business of getting the film made began in earnest one question kept arising – great story, but can the boys act? The answer from me, obviously, was a resounding yes. The reality was, I had no idea. My confidence was based on the belief that a transition from playing personas on music stages to on-screen would be a skip and jump. Six months out from production the trio arrived for their first acting class. It didn't go well. Forget skips and jumps, this was to be a transatlantic flight...

To be fair, it wasn't that the band couldn't act, it was that they didn't know *how* to act and under the tutelage of our amazing acting coach Kieran Lagan that soon changed. But standing on set with my now brothers-in-arms about to do a scene opposite one of the greatest character actors of our generation in Michael Fassbender, the concern resurfaced – are they gonna look like they won their film roles in a raffle?

The answer is not for me to say, but from the moment Kneecap burst onto the music scene their unique talent and magnetism has belied their ostensibly niche output. We are all so proud & excited to bring that same spirit to Sundance, and in doing so break new ground for Irish language cinema.

FILMMAKER BIOGRAPHIES

RICH PEPPIATT | WRITER, DIRECTOR

Rich Peppiatt is a writer & director working across film, TV and commercials.

His debut feature, documentary *One Rogue Reporter*, was adapted from his critically-lauded comedy stage show of the same name, which debuted in 2012 at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival, before embarking on a national tour. The film premiered at Sheffield Doc/Fest and was nominated for Best Independent Feature at the 2014 National Film Awards. It was acquired by Netflix in a multi-territory deal.

Rich has gone on to write over 25 hours of prime time television, which have won awards including a Scottish RTS & BAFTA.

He has written and directed a number of short films which have screened at leading International film festivals. His last short, *Grounded*, was long-listed for the 2020 Academy Awards.

As a former journalist, who became a prominent critic of the tabloid newspaper industry during the Leveson Inquiry, Rich has spoken about his work on the likes of BBC Radio 4, Channel 4 News, Newsnight, Sky News and PBS, as well as writing op-eds for the Guardian, Independent, The Big Issue and Total Politics.

He lives in Belfast.

TREVOR BIRNEY | PRODUCER

TREVOR BIRNEY is an Emmy-nominated producer, award-winning director, author and the founder of Fine Point Films. He most recently produced the Cyndi Lauper documentary, "Let The Canary Sing" which premiered at Tribeca Film Festival. Previously, he produced the Critics' Choice Award-winning and Sundance hit film *The Go-Go's* directed by Alison Ellwood. He directed the RTÉ television documentary series, "Quinn Country" which aired in 2022. His slate also includes Emmy-nominated film *No Stone Unturned* directed by Oscar-winner Alex Gibney, Sundance World Competition film *Gaza*, Emmy-nominated *Elián* for CNN Films, Netflix Originals Documentary *Mercury 13*, *George Best: All By Himself* for ESPN and BBC, *Wave Goodbye To Dinosaurs* in collaboration with Abigail Disney's Fork Films, *Bobby Sands: 66 Days* and HBO's Emmy-winning *Mea Maxima Culpa: Silence in the House of God* directed by Alex Gibney. In 2020, he directed *The Dakota Entrapment Tapes* which premiered at Hot Docs and was released on Sundance Now. He is also the founder of the television production company Below the Radar and the multi-award-winning investigative journalism website The Detail.

JACK TARLING | PRODUCER

Jack has produced two feature films prior to *Kneecap*, *God's Own Country*, which won prizes in 2017 at Sundance, Berlin, Edinburgh, Galway, Chicago, Dinard and 4 British Independent Film Awards including Best Film, and a BAFTA nomination for Outstanding British Film, and *Await Further Instructions*, which won the Audience Award for Best Film at Cinepocalypse in 2018, was Critics Pick in the New York Times and sold to Netflix in a multi-territory deal.

Jack has produced content for Disney/Hulu and worked for a year with Sony Interactive Entertainment in 2019. Jack previously supported development and business affairs across the

film and TV slate for Ridley Scott's company Scott Free. Jack is the co-founder of the Mother Tongues Development Award (run in partnership with Curzon and Charades) which supports the development of UK-set films, by UK-based talent, in which the story dialogue is in a language other than English.

Prior to this his background in short films included exec producing a slate of ten short films for regional screen agency Northern Film + Media and producing *Assessment* which was short listed for a BAFTA and won the Film London Best of Boroughs jury prize in 2010. Jack has also line produced several other films for BBC and BFI including two which premiered at Venice.

Jack is a graduate of Berlinale Talents, Torino Filmlab Extended, Rotterdam Cinemart, Think. Shoot. Distribute. Save Our Scripts (with The Bureau) Film London Micro Market and many other labs and holds a First Class BA (Hons.) Degree in Media Production from Northumbria University.

PATRICK O'NEILL | CO-PRODUCER

Patrick is Founder and Managing Director of Wildcard, an independent film distributor working across Theatrical, Video on Demand, and TV in the UK and Ireland for the last 10 years. Wildcard projects include Wolfwalkers, The Hole In The Ground, The Young Offenders, and Black 47. Wildcard also regularly manage Irish distribution campaigns on behalf of UK Distributors and Platforms, with clients including Amazon, Altitude, Apple, Netflix, and Vertigo.

In 2023, Wildcard moved into film production, with upcoming feature films *Kneecap* and *Fréwaka* set for release in 2024, and a slate of active development projects supported through slate funding by Screen Ireland and Northern Ireland Screen.

Patrick's Executive Producer film credits include *The Hole in the Ground, Black 47, Extra Ordinary, Redemption of a Rogue, Lakelands*, and *KATIE*. He is also Co-Producer on *Crock of Gold: A Few Rounds with Shane MacGowan*.

Patrick sits on the Board of the Irish Film Institute and the Cork Film Festival, is a member of the WRAP Fund Investment Committee, and the Arts Council Peer Panel.

Patrick has 25 years experience in the film industry across a variety of roles, including seven years as an Executive at Screen Ireland and positions in International sales and film Production.

Qualifications include an MA in Audio-Visual Management, MSC in Cyberpsychology, and a BA in Business Studies.

KNEECAP (NAOISE Ó CAIREALLÁIN "MÓGLAÍ BAP," JJ Ó DOCHARTAIGH "DJ PROVAÍ," & LIAM ÓG Ó HANNAIDH "MO CHARA") | "NAOISE," "JJ," and "LIAM ÓG"

Kneecap are part rap group, part Irish cultural phenomenon. Banned by Irish State Broadcaster RTE. Kicked out of their own headline show in Dublin. Publicly condemned by the political party the DUP. These musicians provoke column inches, from the Sunday Times to Channel 4 News, as well as a host of front pages back home. In a few short years the artistry and offstage antics of Mo Chara, Móglaí Bap and DJ Próvaí have built them a notoriety never before seen in Irish music.

What's more, Irish music has never heard Irish music like it. Kneecap's poetic blending of Irish and English in their lyrics has inspired a whole generation of Ireland's youth to rediscover their mother tongue for the modern world.

MICHAEL FASSBENDER | "ARLO Ó'CAIREALLÁIN"

Michael Fassbender is one of the leading actors of his generation. Known for his ability to fully immerse himself in a character, he has carved a career which spans across both independent and blockbuster films, garnering critical acclaim and awards recognition for multiple projects from *Hunger* through to *X Men: Days Of Future Past*. The Oscar, Golden Globe, SAG and BAFTA nominated actor was born in Germany and raised in Killarney, Ireland, and is a graduate of the prestigious Drama Centre. Michael also has a production company, DMC Films, through which he has been developing and producing projects for the last few years.

2023 saw Michael star in David Fincher's Netflix feature, *The Killer*. Michael's performance as 'The Killer' was highly praised by critics with Variety saying Michael "is the perfect actor to inhabit this role, his sullen snake-like glare emitting silent notes of rage and fear."

Last year Michael also starred in Taika Waititi's highly anticipated feature, *Next Goal Wins*, opposite Elisabeth Moss and Will Arnett. The film is an adaptation of the 2014 British football documentary by the same title, following Thomas Rongen (Michael) who attempts to coach and train the American Samoa soccer team to success.

Next up, Michael stars in *Kneecap*, Rich Peppiatt's feature which will premiere at Sundance Film Festival 2024. The film explores the birth of the infamous Irish rap group, Kneecap. 2024 will also see Michael star in Korean thriller *Hope*, directed by Na Hong-jin (*The Wailing*). Alicia Vikander, Hoyeon and Taylor Russell will also star.

In 2019, Michael reprised the role of 'Magneto' in X-Men: Dark Phoenix, following his appearance in X-Men First Class (2011), X Men: Days Of Future Past (2014) and X Men: Apocalypse (2016).

2017 saw Michael taking on the role of 'Harry Hole' in Thomas Alfredson's adaptation of Jo Nesbo's acclaimed crime thriller *The Snowman*, opposite Rebecca Ferguson. In the same year, the actor also reprised his role as android 'David' in Ridley Scott's *Alien: Covenant*, opposite Noomi Rapace and Katherine Waterston in May.

Michael was also seen in *Song To Song* from acclaimed director Terence Malick, co-starring Ryan Gosling, Natalie Portman and Rooney Mara. The film premiered at SXSW Festival in Austin. He was also seen in *Trespass Against Us*, which had its world premiere at The Toronto International Film Festival, and then its UK premiere at the LFF, releasing in January 2017 in the US, and early March in the UK. The film co-stars Brendan Gleeson and Lyndsey Marshall and was written by Alistair Siddons. Michael also received a BIFA nomination for his role as 'Chad'.

At the end of 2016 Michael was seen starring in *Assassin's Creed*, the screen adaptation of the massive Ubisoft game series. Michael took on two roles, that of 'Callum Lynch' as well as his ancestor 'Aguilar'. The narrative moves between present day and 15th Century Spain, during the Spanish Inquisition. The incredible cast includes Marion Cotillard, Jeremy Irons and Michael K. Williams, and was directed by Justin Kurzel (*Snowtown Murders*, *Macbeth*). 2016 also saw Michael in the film adaptation of ML Steadman's bestselling novel *The Light Between Oceans*. Directed by Derek Cianfrance (*Blue Valentine*, *Place Beyond the Pines*) and co-starring Alicia Vikander and Rachel Weisz, the film saw received its world premiere at the Venice Film Festival.

In 2015, Michael received multiple nominations for his critically acclaimed performance as 'Steve Jobs', in Danny Boyle's film about the Apple founder. Reviews were glowing, with critics lauding his performance saying 'Fassbender gives a towering performance of savage wit and limitless firepower' (*Rolling Stone*), which 'leaves Jobs fascinatingly elusive, both genius and sociopath' (*Empire*).

Michael is fortunate to have collaborated with several applauded directors multiple times during his career. In 2015 he took on the much revered role of 'Macbeth' in Justin Kurzel's dark and visceral Michael of the Scottish Play. Marion Cotillard starred opposite him as 'Lady Macbeth'. In 2012 and 2013 Michael worked with Ridley Scott on *Prometheus* and *The Counsellor* respectively. Also in 2013, he reteamed with Steve McQueen for the highly acclaimed *12 Years A Slave*. He received Academy Award, Golden Globe, BAFTA, SAG and Independent Spirit nominations for Best Supporting Actor, for his role as plantation owner 'Edwin Epps', while the movie won Best Picture at the Academy Awards, Golden Globes, BAFTA, PGA and Broadcast Critics Choice Awards.

Previous to that, Michael's performance as 'Bobby Sands' in Steve McQueen's *Hunger* won critical acclaim, and following the film's Camera D'Or winning premiere at Cannes in 2008, Michael scooped up numerous awards including the British Independent Film Award (BIFA), Irish Film & Television Award (IFTA) and the London Film Critics Circle Award for Best Actor. Again with Steve McQueen, he took on the role of a sex addict in *Shame*, which won him the Volpi Cup for Best Actor at the 2011 Venice Film Festival, the Irish Film & Television Award, and BAFTA and Golden Globe nominations for Best Actor.

In 2011, Michael was seen as the young 'Magneto' opposite James McAvoy's 'Professor X' in Matthew Vaughn's *X-Men First Class* which he reprised his role with follow up films; *X Men: Days Of Future Past* (2014) and *X Men: Apocalypse* (2016). He was also seen as 'Carl Jung' opposite Viggo Mortensen's 'Sigmund Freud' in David Cronenberg's *A Dangerous Method* and as 'Edward Rochester' opposite Mia Wasikowska in Cary Fukunaga's *Jane Eyre*. Michael was the recipient of numerous international awards and nominations in recognition of his performances in more than one film including the Evening Standard British Film Award for Best Actor for *Jane Eyre* and *Shame*, the London Critics Circle Film Award for Best Actor for *Shame* and *A Dangerous Method*, the Los Angeles Film Critics Association Award for Best Actor for *X-Men First Class*, *Jane Eyre*, *A Dangerous Method*, and Shame, and the National Board of Review's Spotlight Award for *A Dangerous Method*, *X-Men First Class*, *Jane Eyre* and *Shame*.

Other notable projects include; *Slow West*, with Ben Mendelsohn and produced by DMC Films. The Western received critical acclaim upon its premiere at Sundance Film Festival, as did 2014's *Frank*, directed by Lenny Abrahamson, with Domnhall Gleeson and Maggie Gyllenhaal. Andrea Arnold's *Fish Tank*, Zack Snyder's *300* with Gerard Butler and Lena Headey. Quentin Tarantino's *Inglourious Basterds* opposite Brad Pitt and Diane Kruger, British horror *Eden Lake* with Kelly Reilly and Jack O'Connell, Francois Ozon's *Angel*, Joel Schumacher's *Town Creek*, Neil Marshall's *Centurion*, Jimmy Hayward's *Jonan Hex* and HBO series *Band Of Brothers* from Tom Hanks and Steve Spielberg.

Simone's film credits include BAFTA nominated feature *Notes On Blindness* (Archers Mark), and Ken Loach's feature *Jimmys Hall*, playing the female lead, Oonagh.

Born in Belfast.

Josie played Northern Irish midwife NRT in the recent BAFTA winning BBC series *This Is Going To Hurt*. Tv work also includes the exciting upcoming second series of Disney's *Andor*, *White House Farm*, *Vera*, *Call The Midwife*, *Waterloo Road* and *Psychoville*.

Josie has played leading and supporting roles in the upcoming BBC/BFI feature films *In Camera* and *Edge of Summer*, Netflix hit *The Wonder* directed by Chilean Director Sebastian Lelio, playing Sister Michael alongside Florence Pugh, and Kenneth Branagh's Oscar winning *Belfast* where she played opposite Catriona Balfe as her sister, Aunt Violet.

Josie has worked extensively in theatre for the last 3 decades creating original roles in West End musicals such as Andrew Lloyd Webber and Ben Elton's *The Beautiful Game* where she played Belfast heroine Mary Maguire which earned her her first Olivier Award nomination for Best actress in a Musical 2001.
